Daughter Catharine Dobbins in case she survives me and my will is that my aforesaid property be divided in the manner above mentioned immediately after my decease in case they survive me if only one be living then the whole to go to such living Child and I also solemnly declare that I will not make any other will or instrument or sign any other then this to diminish or deprive my aforesaid son and daughter in the proportion above mentioned at any time hereafter and I do hereby revoke and make void any other wills and testaments by me at any time made or testimony that in my last will and testament contained on this piece of paper of the said Catharine Dobbins Senior wife of my said and seal this sixteenth day of March in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty six Catharine Dobbins (S) signed sealed published and declared her last will and testament on the day of the date above mentioned in the presence of the witnesses who have their names subscribed their names as witnesses in the presence of her request and in the presence of each other Wm London & Henry Sted.

On the Twelfth day of April in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty eight Administration with the will annexed of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of Catharine Dobbins formerly of the parish of Saint Pauls in the County of Widdessex but late of the parish of Saint Mary Abchurch in the same County Widow deceased was granted to William John Dobbins Dobbins the natural and lawful son only Child and as such the Universal Executor named in the said will having been first sworn duly to Administer.

In the Name of God Amen
 I Catharina Dorrien of Charles Street Capeshish Square in the County of Widdessex Widow being in perfect health and memory blessed be God for the same but knowing the certainty of death and the uncertainty of the time thereof do hereby make publish and declare this my last will and testament in writing in the manner and form following that is to say I surrender my soul into the hands of Almighty God now aape of hoping and assuredly believing that thro' the merits death and mediation of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ to obtain full and free pardon and remission of all my sins first I desire to be secretly and privately buried a'burse without a hearse and one Coach in the Lutheran Church of the Holy Trinity in Trinity Lane London I give and bequeath

to my Daughter Anna Dorrice and Catharina Dorrice all
 my household furniture of what nature or kind soever
 also what Linen and wearing Apparel I may be
 possessed of to be for their use in common as long as
 they shall continue unmarried and keep house together
 but in case one of them shall marry the Daughter
 so marrying shall on the day of Marriage Relinquish and
 be deprived of any share of the said household furniture
 and Linen bequeathed my meaning being that the said
 household furniture and Linen shall remain undivided
 and that on the Marriage or Death of either of my
 said Daughters that it shall become the property of
 of her who shall remain unmarried at her decease and
 become her sole property and whereas I have my
 first birth place Old Jewry London for which I reserve
 5 per Cent Interest of give and devise unto my
 Brother Henry Dorrice of Pontifras in the County of
 Essex and to Thomas Dorrice of Wakefoot Hertfordshire
 Henry Dorrice Merchant and to their heirs One thousand
 and four hundred pounds Upon Trust to pay the Interest
 thereof to my Daughter Aqueta Pingham Wife of the
 deceased William Pingham for and during the term of
 her natural life for her sole and separate use independent
 of the Debts Contract or Engagement of her present or
 any after taken Husband and from and after her
 decease upon Trust to sell the same and to divide
 the Money arising thereby among her Children as she
 may by Will direct of give and devise unto the
 same her Children as above mentioned and to
 their heirs One thousand four hundred pounds upon
 Trust to pay the Interest thereof to my Daughter
 Catharina Dorrice Wife of the deceased John Chandler for and
 during the term of her natural life for her sole and
 separate use independent of the Debts Contract or
 Engagement of her present or any after taken Husband
 and from and after her decease upon Trust to sell the
 same and divide the Money arising thereby among
 her Children as she may by Will direct of give and
 bequeath to my Daughter Anna Dorrice One thousand
 four hundred pounds and to my Daughter Catharina Dorrice
 One thousand four hundred pounds and the rest and
 residue of Money I may be possessed of at my decease
 I shall and bequeath to my Daughter Anna and
 Catharina Dorrice share and share alike my plate and
 Jewells I dispose of in the following manner I shall
 and bequeath to my Daughter Aqueta Pingham one
 of my long silver Waiters silver Coffee pot my Gold
 watch with Diamond and Ruby Ring to my Daughter
 Catharina Chandler I shall and bequeath my silver
 Tea pot and Milk pot and my large brilliant Hat to

my Daughter Anna Dorrison I leave and bequeath One
 large Silver Watch and my pair of my Silver Caudle
 and my Diamond Earrings to my Daughter Catharina
 Dorrison I leave and bequeath all the rest and residue
 of my plate of what kind or sort soever my three
 Diamond Stars Rings &c. and all the Trifles I may
 be possessed of at my Decease I leave and bequeath
 to my Brother Henry Dorrison of Pontifex in the
 County of Middlesex fifty pounds to Mr. Lewis of Fredericks
 plate Old Henry London fifty pounds and to Thomas
 Dorrison Esquire twenty pounds I appoint my Daughter
 Anna Dorrison and Catharina Dorrison joint Executrix of this
 my last Will and Testament written by me Witness my
 hand November the 7th 1705 & Catharina Dorrison & Frederick
 Barry.

Appeared Personally Charles Lambert of the
 City of London Merchant and made Oath that he knew
 and was well acquainted with Catharina Dorrison late of the
 parish of Saint Mary le Bow in the County of Middlesex
 widow deceased for six Years and upwards before and
 to the time of her Death which happened as this Depo-
 nent hath been informed and believes on or about the twenty
 fifth day of the Month of March last past and that
 the said deceased made the said Oath and said that he also
 knew and was well acquainted with the said deceased
 manner and Character of handwriting and of writing
 and subscribing her name having often seen the said
 deceased write and also write and subscribe her
 name and having well with care and attention viewed
 and reviewed the paper writing her will annexed being
 it purporting to be and contain the last Will and
 Testament of the said deceased the said Will beginning
 thus "In the Name of God Amen I Catharina Dorrison of
 Charles Street Cabotwell Square in the County of Middlesex
 widow being in perfect health and memory blessed be
 God for the same but knowing the Certainty of Death
 and the Uncertainty of the time thereof do hereby make
 publish and declare this my last Will and Testament in
 Writing and ending thus I appoint my Daughters Anna
 Dorrison and Catharina Dorrison joint Executrix of this
 my last Will and Testament written by me Witness my
 hand and thus subscribed Catharina Dorrison and dated
 this November the 7th 1705 he this Depo-
 nent doth verily
 and in his Conscience believe the said written beginning
 and ending of the said Will as set out
 and the said words date and subscription thereto and
 the words "one pair of my" written on an Erasure
 in the sixth and seventh lines of the last side of the

said Will and the whole of the Goods being and contents hereof to be all of the proper handwriting, making and subscribing and to have been wholly written, dated and subscribed by the said Catharina Jorissa widow deceased, the said Will was proved the said Charles Lambert was duly sworn to the truth of the within written Affidavit before Me J. Nichol sur. pers. Nath. Goring Not. Pub.

was proved at London the tenth day of April in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Eighty Eight before the Worshipful John Bridall Doctor of Laws and Surrogate of the Right Worshipful Peter Calvert Doctor of Laws Master Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of Ann Jorissa Spinster and Catharina Jorissa Spinster the daughters of the deceased and executrix named in the said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said deceased they having been first sworn duly to Administer
